

Message from the head:

This week we had our Full Governing Body meeting for this half term. During these meetings I give an update on everything that has been happening in the school and as I reflected on the period from returning after the winter break to now I was struck by just how much the teachers, staff and children have managed to squeeze into what is a really short half term and in very trying circumstances facing staff short-ages and children absence as we continue to battle through positive cases of Covid and the associated isolation periods. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the staff, and you families, for everything you are doing and continue to do in the face of

these challenges. Another item we looked at in the governors meeting this week was the results of the parent survey that was completed just before Christmas. It was really heartening to see the many positive comments that you made and to reflect on some of the areas that were raised for us to think about improving or adapting. The results were overwhelmingly positive and showed improvements in nearly all areas surveyed with 98% of you feeling your children do well and happy to recommend the school to other parents and 100% feeling we support the wider development of the children. After half term I will be sending out more detailed information on the results but wanted to say thankyou for

your continued trust in us.

Finally, a big well done to our Year 5 class who today kicked of the Spring Term Class Assemblies with their brilliant space landing inspired assembly. Hampstead Heath Cycle Train Proposal for School Runs

Following feedback from parents and Green School Runs regarding the need for more active travel opportunities in Hampstead to offset the narrow and often saturated roads around school drop off and pick-up times, Camden council are in initial discussions with City of London Corporation to explore the idea of organising a trial 'cycle train' for children and parents/carers across the Heath.
