Attendance Award

Our Attendance Award this week goes to Reception with over 99%! There was a lot of absence this week with no other clas above 95%. Have a look at page 2 for a breakdown of attendance across the term and those children with 100% attendance this term.



We know it has been very challenging times with Covid still around and other bugs back in circulation after so much isolation during the pandemic. For that reason we are not surprised to be slightly below our target of 96% but hope, as the weather improves and immunity increases that we can pick up through the summer term and reach 96% by the end of the year.

We'd like to thank the majority of families who ensure that their children are building resilience by coming in even if not feeling 100% and also make sure they arrive on time and are sat in class by 9am ready to learn. If you are one of the families who is regularly late, even if you think it is only a few minutes, we ask you to really try and improve next term. Even arriving at school a couple of minutes is very disruptive to your child's learning and the learning of the rest of the class.


You try so hard in all our lessons and it shows in all your fantastic progress. We are lucky to have such a kind and hard working person in our class. Well done, I'm proud of you!

It could be someone we have talked about in assembly, or someone you have learnt about in class or even someone you have learnt about from your own reading or investigations.













Ihisweekin Year 1... Topic: Wild!
