As in previous weeks the majority of children are getting to school on time. This week reception, as is often the case, were the best with only 2 lates. Great effort Year 6. no class this week had double figures which is a great improvement but overall still too many children arriving late—38 across the school. Our Attendance Award this week goes to Year 3 with 100%! That is our first 100% for some time. Year 4 were so close as well with 99.56%. Along with Year 6 (96%) they were the only three classes above our 96% target last week. Year 5 and Year 2 were so close to making it (both 95.9%). Overall it is an improvement with overall attendance for the week across the school at 96.5%. Well done everyone. If we are going to reach our yearly target of 96% (currently 95.6%) then we need to continue this pattern. Let's keep improving!














Summer Term Topics

Year 3 have been very busy this week—they had a wonderful trip to London zoo where they enjoyed seeing lots of different animals but by far the most popular experience was petting the goats! They also went out later in the week to visit the London Central Mosque—a big thank you to Peter for all the interesting information they learnt. Back in school they have been continuing to work on the principles from our 'Lifting Limits' work looking at the book 'the Paper Bag Princess' and discussing the gender stereotypes found in it.



This week Year 4 visited to zoo to investigate all the different animals found there, especially those usually found in the rainforest. The monkeys proved to be particularly popular! They did some brilliant writing inspired by the visit. They also painted and finished off their Macaw Parrot models, which, we are sure you'll agree, look incredible! Some of the children could definitely get jobs in set and prop design on the showing of these models made completely from scratch with nothing more than newspaper and using papier-mâché modelling techniques!

What a busy week for the children this week. In their weekly coaching session with Arsenal they were looking at ball skills and control. Then they spent an afternoon with their Year 2 'Buddies' reading and working on the planting in the raised beds (see Y2 page for more photos of them). It's going well with progress already clear. Back in school, as well as lots of writing they have been doing some wonderful observational sketches of sea shells and experimenting with shading— as you can see the results are impressive.
