For your positivity. You have such a wonderful attitude and always strive to do the right kind. You are consistently kind and helpful to those around you.


Year 4

Well done for your enthusiasm this week whilst we've started learning our assembly lines. You've given us all a great model for energy and commitment. Keep it up!
















