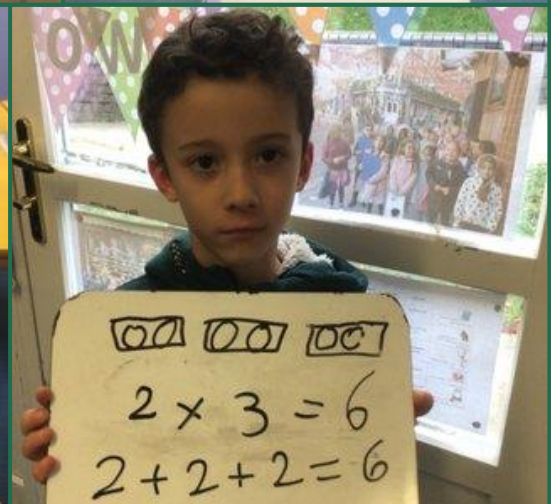
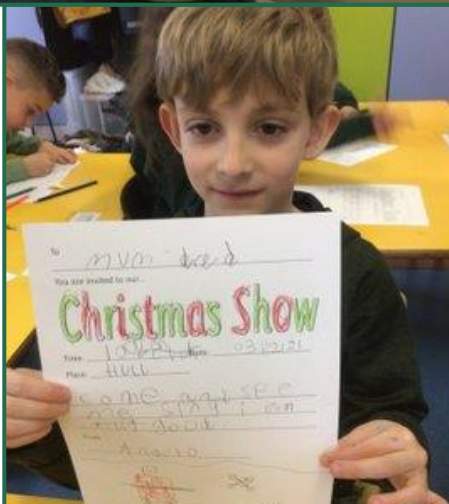




This week in Year 2...

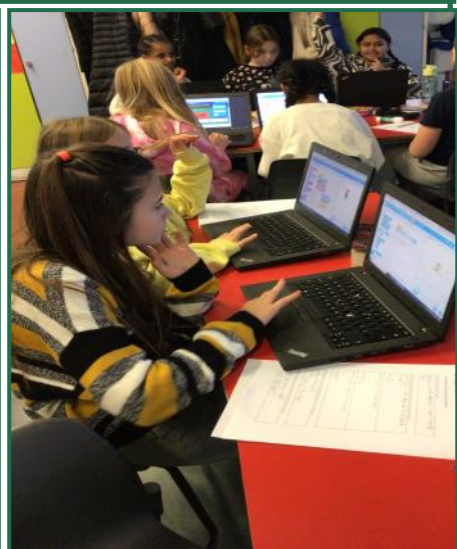
