Its been another very busy week as we approach the end of what is such a short half term. Hampstead Heath Cycle Train Proposal for School Runs

Following feedback from parents and Green School Runs regarding the need for more active travel opportunities in Hampstead to offset the narrow and often saturated roads around school drop off and pick-up times, Camden council are in initial discussions with City of London Corporation to explore the idea of organising a trial 'cycle train' for children and parents/carers across the Heath. A (or several) departure points could be set up for parents/carers and their children to meet, in order to cycle through Hampstead Heath as a group during the
