

ParentHub

The ParentHub app allows us to communicate with you all—send letters and notices—for free if you have the app installed. For those of you who do not we incur a charge every time we send you a message. Over a school year those charges build up and cost us a considerable amount of money that we would much rather be spending on staffing and improving the richness of our curriculum. At present we have 89% of the families in school signed up and using ParentHub. We want to have 100% so that we can spend that money elsewhere. Punctuality Award

This week, as usual, the majority of children managed to get to school on time. However, we are sorry to say the children who did not manage this and came in late has increased to nearly 60 for the week. Reception take the prize this week with 4 with no other class having less than 5. Year 2 and Year 6 really need to improve—both were into double figures this week. It is not fair on the rest of the children who get here on time for children to be regularly arriving late and disturbing the learning or others. Please ensure your child is in school early enough so that they can be sat in their class at 9am ready to start the day. For the majority of you who manage this every week, thank you.



Attendance Award

Attendance continues to be very low but is creeping up as children return from illness and we all start to build up immunity to the various bugs around. All classes bar one were above 90% this week and 3 classes were above 95% (Years 4, 5 and 6). Well done to year 5, this week's winners with 99.3%. A great effort. For the week we were at 94.2%, still a way below the 96% target we have. For the academic year we are still way down on that target at 91.8%. We would like to thank you for your support in ensuring the children miss as little time as possible and that you help us to help them to build resilience so as to maximise their time in school and their opportunities to learn.

Fleet Primary School Calendar Competition 2024



This year's theme...**A Wonderful World!**
