Message from the head:

Another busy week with some brilliant work and events happening. Thank to those parents who were able to come along to the KS1 and KS2 open reading morning on Wednesday.

I wanted to make a plea to you all about our Thursday class teas. Prepandemic these were a fantastic social opportunity for the Fleet community to come together in the hall, sit together and enjoy a cup of tea and snack/treat. Since we have been able to resume these following the relaxing of Covid restrictions attendance is well down. It could be that people maybe aren't aware—especially newer families who maybe joined the school during the period we didn't have them. While they offer a good fundraising opportunity (all proceeds go towards the school's curriculum budget and help fund trips and workshops) what I think made them special at Fleet was that social element—and I think we would all agree the thing we all missed during Covid was social contact so I hope we can get back to a more well attended 'Class Tea'. As a reminder, each class tea is led by each class on a rolling basis. Entries should be handed in to the school office and should have the child's name and class on the back (in pencil) along with an indication of the person or event that inspired it.

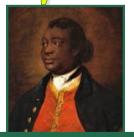


















What a fantastic performance from this brilliant group of young people—a real Tudor history lesson (with brilliant singing and dancing)!
