



We have come to the end of this week's enforced shortened week. I was reflecting on the two strike days, also at the time when Debbie and I are working on the budget for the coming year, on the various pressures facing us as a school. We are in the lucky position for now where we are almost full, the main measure on how a school is funded. However, even with that advantage, we've been struggling from year to year to provide the school community with the support and educational environment everyone should be entitled do. It is for that reason, whatever the outcome of the disagreement between the government and the teaching unions, I sincerely hope that the pay rises that are eventually agreed are funded pay rises (as the NEU are asking for) and not simply more increased running costs schools have to find from already over-stretched budgets. On the topic of costs to school, we had some bad news this week in terms of our plans to upgrade the junior playground. As you may or may not know the school and the Parent's Association has been working very hard, since before lockdown, to raise enough money to renovate the junior playground. It is long overdue but sadly something that is very expensive to do and we've never had enough money in the main school budget to do it. We were handed an opportunity to get playground equipment from the old Carlton School site which meant we could reduce the costs significantly by needing to pay for the resurfacing required and the move and installation of this equipment without having to outlay on the equipment itself. This week the work was due to start. Unfortunately, what was discovered on disassembly at Carlton was that the equipment was breaking up on disassembly due to extensive damage and rot that was not apparent on inspection. It means we are not able to proceed at this time. We are now waiting to find out how much (and how long it would take to source) equipment from new so we can see how far off we are in the money we had set aside. This is still a major priority for us. I will keep you posted on any further progress. It does lead me to urge you all to continue to support our fundraising efforts, such as the Class Teas (run by class reps every Thursday (Year 3's is happening next Tuesday due to being postponed on Thursday's school closure) and the upcoming Parents' Association events like the International Food Evening coming up or the 30th March (see page 2) as well as the Summer Fair later in the year. It is only through the generosity in your time and donations for events like these that we are able to make projects such as the playground come to fruition. I will continue to work hard trying to raise money where I can but I need your help too. Have a great weekend and see you next week.

Punctuality Award

Attendance Award

There is still a lot of illness circulating with many children suffering from high fevers which for some classes affected attendance this week. Year 4 were the only class with over 96% attendance (the school target) with 97.4%. Close but not quite at the target level were Year 1 with 95.1% and Year 5 with 94.1%. All other classes were well below with Reception dipping below 90% for the second week in a row. For the week we were 92.8%. Hopefully, all the children who have been ill make a speedy recovery. We continue to ask that you don't be over cautious about keeping the children at home when they are a little under the weather. In most situations where children are not feeling great when they wake up, coming in to school and getting moving around and distracted, results in them managing the day and not missing their learning. If they aren't managing having come in we will of course call you to collect them. For the year, we are steady at 92.8%. Let's try to get back up in the high 90s in each class again so we can move towards our 96% target. A big thank you for your continued support.
