

### Message from the head:

Sent home with this newsletter was the report we received this week from OFSTED regarding our recent inspection. We are really pleased with how the inspection went and feel the Inspector really got a good feel for our school community. In the many discussions I had with him I was reassured that what we see as real strengths of the school—our amazing curriculum, the personal development of the children through visits and experiences, the performing arts, our SEND provision and the fantastic children we have—was what he saw too. The areas we had already identified through our school development plan for this year were also confirmed by what he saw, namely, further developing our assessment approaches in the foundation subjects and continuing to embed and build consistency in our delivery of the new Phonics programme we launched in the EYFS and KS1. OFSTED inspections can be a stressful time for the staff and especially so after the events of the last few years of disruption caused by the pandemic and this inspection was under a new and very different framework from the last time we were inspected. The staff and children were brilliant throughout, showing the inspector what happens in Fleet on a day to day basis. We are delighted that the outcome was that he believes, as we do, that Fleet is a good school.

I would like to thank all the staff and children and the parents who took time to complete the inspection questionnaire. Having the assurance that the priorities we had identified and were working on this year from an external eye is brilliant and we will be working over the next few months to turn these areas of development into areas of strength. If you have any questions about the report please do get in touch. It should be available on the OFSTED website shortly but for now you have the digital copy sent out with this newsletter.

Next week we have our Winter Fair, as always organised by a group of amazingly dedicated parents in the Fleet Parent's Association. They do so much for the school. I hope as many of you as possible will be able to come along on the afternoon next Friday to help set up, help out on stalls and come and enjoy the event itself. We hope very shortly to have raised enough money through the PA as well as secured some external funding to finally put in some climbing/play equipment into the junior playground replacing the old and tired wooden structures that are currently there. It seems a long time since we first started trying to do this—the pandemic coming along and removing our fundraising and grant application opportunities has really held us up. Then the global increase in the cost of labour and materials has also meant delays. It is great to be getting close at last. A successful Winter Fair will really help us get over the line. There are signup sheets to help with the set up and running in the covered area outside the hall. Please do sign up. Have a wonderful weekend and I look forward to seeing you all next week as do the teachers in next week's parent conferences. Please ensure you have signed up to a slot if you haven't already.
