

#### Message from the head:

What an exciting week we had for our year 5 children this week with a fantastic 'Flying into Physics' 3 day workshop with Scarabeus theatre. The children were learning about forces and did this by using pulleys and harnesses to 'fly' and lift things on ropes in the hall. Teachers had a go in our INSET this week and I think many were jealous of the year 5 children! Today year 5 shared their learning in the hall and when the other children saw what they had been doing many were wanting a go! That type of hands on learning really exemplifies the power of experience and why at Fleet we devote so much time to taking the children out to museums and galleries as well as having practical workshops back here in the school too. Seeing the learning from books and theory in practice really helps the children to absorb it and I am sure year 5 will remember what they learnt about forces this week for a very long time.

Next week also has a number of great experiences planned for the children—don't forget to check back at the calendar dates sent out as part of the newsletter each week—as teachers find and book new things we add them into this. This week it is on page 3.

As you will have seen in the news this week, the NEU, the biggest teaching union, has announced a series of strikes during February and March. I will send a separate letter home early next week once we are clear on how this will affect Fleet. It is likely that we will be closed to children on the first planned strike day, the 1st February, as all our teachers are members of this union and plan to take action that day, as soon as I know about the dates in March I will be able to let you know. #### **ParentHub**

This app allows us to communicate with you all-send letters and notices-for free. For those of you who do not have the app we incur a charge every time we send you a message. Those charges build up and cost us a considerable amount of money that we would much rather be spending on staffing and improving the richness of our curriculum. At present we have 89% of the families in school signed up and using ParentHub. We



want 100% so that we can spend that money elsewhere. If you've had any problems installing the app or adding the school and your children please speak to Lisa in the office who is happy to help.

#### Punctuality Award

This week, as usual, the majority of children managed to get to school on time. While we had less lates overall this week (41 compared to 60 last week) it is still



far too many. It is generally the same children who arrive late meaning they continually arrive flustered to their lesson, missing the beginning and also interrupting the learning of their peers. Parents of those children need to do better to ensure their children develop good habits of punctuality and get here on time. If there is some impediment to this happening please speak to us and we will help. We hope to see a marked improvement for those children. Reception take the prize (again!) this week with only 2 lates. Year 1 close with 3. If the youngest can get here on time there is no excuse for year 2 and year 6 having 10!

#### Attendance Award

Attendance continues to creep up for most classes, with EYFS especially showing an improvement this week. All classes except year 4 are now comfortably above 90% and out of the persistent absence area for the week. Year 6 this week also achieving above our target figure with the best attendance at 97% - well done to them. Year 2 came very close to the target of 96% with 95.2% and Year 5 not too far behind them with 94.5%. It's great to see the Reception and Year 1 children returning from illnesses with 93.5% and 93% respectively. Regular attendance is so improtant for all classes but especially in those classes to avoid gaps appearing in their reading due to missing improtant new sounds in the dily phonics sessions. For the week we were at 93.6%, still a way below the 96% target we have. For the academic year we are still way down on that target at 92.1% but it is creeping up each week—lets hope it continues.





Well done to these children who have been chosen by their class teachers to be the 'Star of the Week' - Well done to all these children, and to all the rest who might not have been picked this week but could have been.
