I know how amazing the staff are at Fleet but when people from outside come in to see it, it helps make all the hard work worthwhile. Just before Easter we had a visit from Marion Hunter, she is our Professional Partner from Camden Learning. She came in and worked with Oona, our curriculum lead, and they spent the day meeting with groups of children from all the classes, looking at books together and talking about their learning. There was a particular focus on assessment and how we know the children are progressing through their topics in all the different subjects. Marion was very impressed by the consistency she heard from the children—from the youngest to the oldest—and how clear it was that they enjoyed and were motivated by their learning. I wanted to share a couple of comments from Marion with you. She said *'The care and attention to detail in topic planning is impressive...children obviously enjoy learning and talk about work studied...the wide variety of teaching strategies used excited and reinforced understanding'*. As we start this new term and introduce the new topic that will be the thread for all the learning in the different subjects this term I want to thank the staff for the amazing jobs they do.

I know many of you will have come to the end of your fasting for Ramadan with the sighting of the new moon last night. I hope all your Eid celebrations go well. 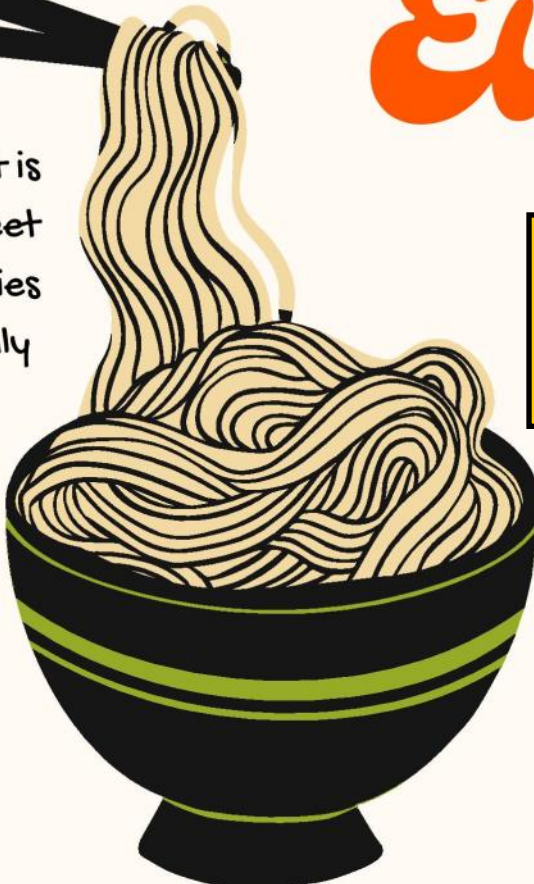

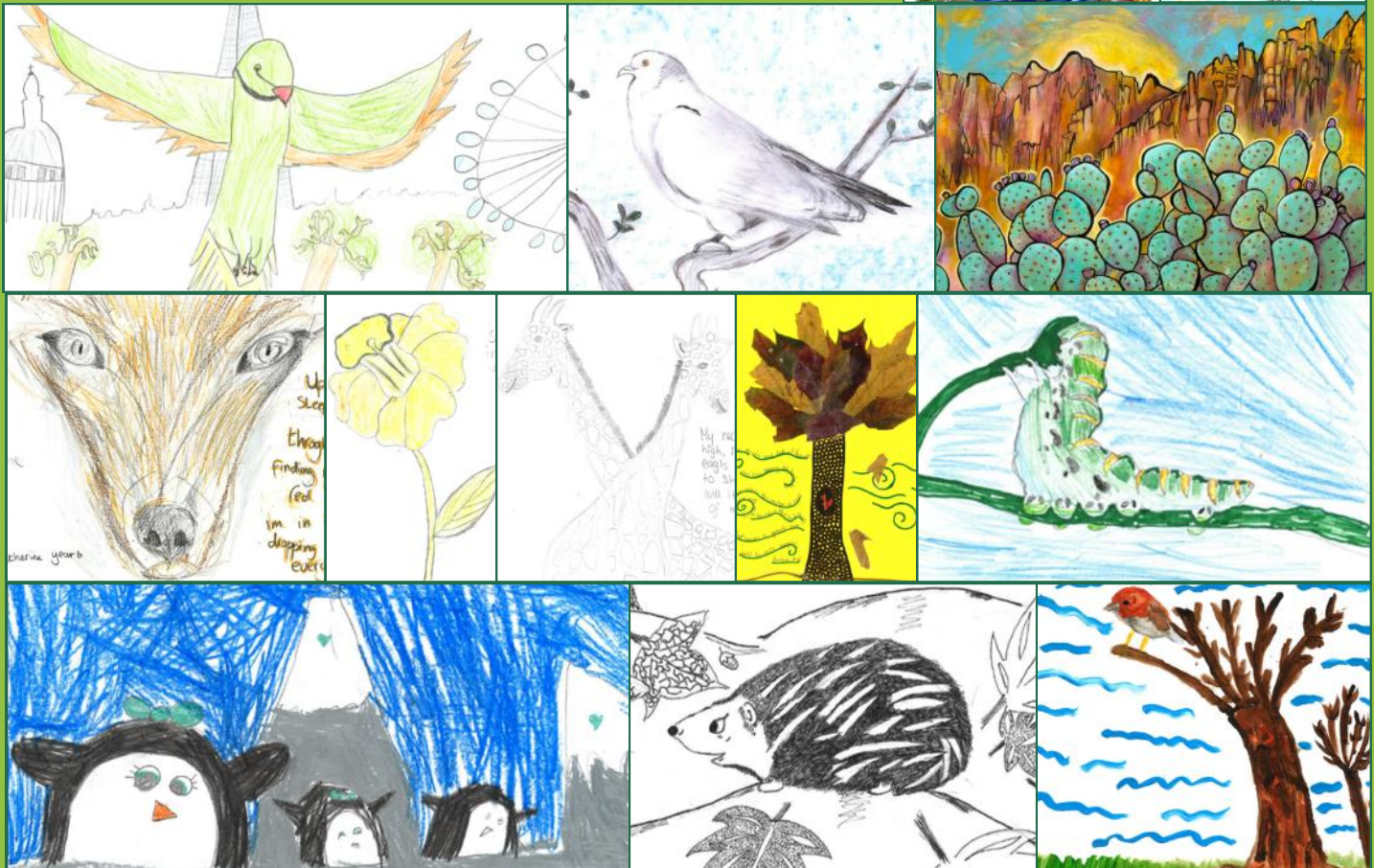
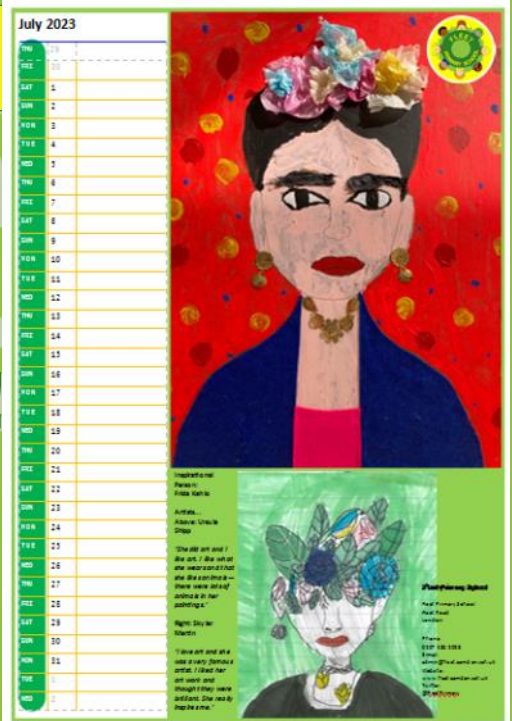
Fleet Primary School Calendar Competition 2024

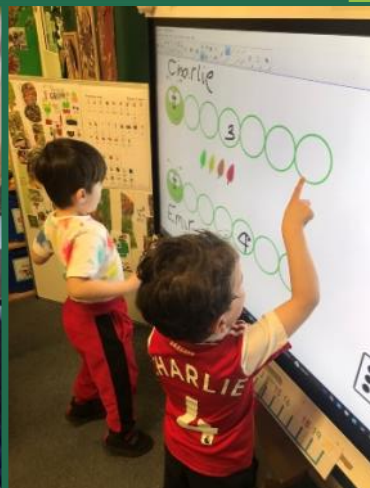


This week at Fleet...
