Message from the NEU Members at Fleet

The teachers at Fleet have asked that their thanks be passed to all families for the understanding and support they experienced this last year in terms of the strike action they took which led to a number of school closures. Their decisions to take this action was led by a belief that any increase to their pay should be funded and not paid for from existing school budgets. They understand that children missing school is not what they want but that the implications of any increase not being funded would lead to even worse problems for children in the long term, with less money in school budgets to pay for the staff and resources they know our children need. As you may have seen in the press, the government has offered an improved pay offer to teachers including an offer to fund much of the increase. While some of the detail has yet to be clarified, it is likely that this offer will be accepted and prevent further strike action as we move into next year. For your understanding and support, from all of them, thank you.

Universal Free School Meals

Thanks to the much welcome move of the Mayor of London, all children from Reception to Year 6 in London primary schools will be able to receive a free school meal for their lunch everyday (not just those who qualify for FSM on the current government measure). This should really help many families currently paying for meals by saving them £12.60 a week per child.

We have been approached by some families who are in the position to be able to afford to pay towards school meals and, as they are now going to be free, would like to make a regular donation to the school instead. Donating money in this way would be very welcome and will go a long way to supporting the school as we go through our own funding difficulties and help us to continue to provide the rich curriculum we do as well as ensuring the school site is fit for purpose and staffed to support the children as best we can. We are currently looking into the best and most convenient way to do this and will send something home in early September with instructions. Thanks in anticipation for any help you can give no matter how small.

Class with the least amount of lates this year was the incredible **Year 3** class with 99!







This year, as has been widely publicised in the press, has been one with very low attendance. It has at Fleet been the worst year for some time. Having been one of the schools in Camden with the highest attendance over the last few years and showing continued improvement since before Covid this year that run was ended.

tendance and Punctual ity

While there has been a number of illnesses circulating throughout the year (as all schools have faced) we have also seen a huge increase in the number of children missing for extended periods due to taking breaks in term time. We really hope that from September, with a fresh start and the new academic year, we can get back to where we were with the children's attendance and academic development taking priority. While we recognise that there may be family emergencies and situations that are exceptional and require some time off, which with the correct proof we can authorise. What we cannot authorise moving forward is holidays being taken in term time. We sympathise with the added cost to travelling in school holidays, it's something staff face too so we are not blind to it, but it is not an acceptable reason for taking children out of school.

The research evidence is clear that for children below our attendance target of 96%, they do not make the progress or achieve the levels of attainment as those above 96%.

Having achieved 96% for 3 straight years we just missed it last year (95.2%) but as you can see below, this year we were a long way off. Our annual target is 96%. We have missed it this year for the first time in 3 years. In fact only two classes managed to get within 1% of our target. **Well done Year 4 and Year 6**.

One pleasing aspect of this year has been the number of children coming in to school late (although it is still far too many!) improved by over 400 lates on last year. While the majority of you do an amazing job getting the children ready in the morning and in to school on time, there is a significant number who have unacceptable levels of lateness. These children are missing their own learning as well as disturbing the learning of the other children. Please endeavour to do all you can to get the children to school on time. We will continue to help you in any way we can. A huge **well done to Year 3** who had by far the least amount of lates. Next year we want all classes well below 100—there is no reason that this should not be possible.

Finally, we want to say thank you for your support in making sure your children are here on time and as often as they possibly can be. One of the biggest factors involved in children ending school with the expected levels is their attendance. Let improve and smash 96% again next year as we did previously.




































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
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
