Message from the head: As Christmas events are added into the already packed curriculum there seems more and more to do! I can't thank my staff enough for how hard they are currently working to juggle all the plates required of them. I'd like to thank you too for finding time this week to attend your parents' meetings—they are so important so that you and we are working together to ensure our children make the most progress possible. It was disappointing that some parents were not able to attend their planned meetings and also that they did not inform the school, meaning that teachers are left waiting in the evening as are other parents who could have their meetings brought forward. We understand life can sometimes throw up unexpected problems but we would ask that you keep communication lines as open as possible so that we can adjust and support you as applicable.

I met with some of the school governors this week when the Curriculum and Standards sub-committee met. We looked at the current assessment data as well as the recent OFSTED inspection. I shared my concerns with them around attendance and punctuality and the impact that is likely to have on the children's attainment as well as our ability to provide catch-up support where needed. As you will see below, attendance is very low at the moment. So of you will be receiving invites soon to come and meet with me to discuss these issues and see how we can work together to improve things for your children. Research consistently shows that the children who achieve the best outcomes from education are those with the best attendance. I do think there is a danger, post pandemic, that we are a little too quick to keep our children off school when they have minor coughs and colds. Please do consider this when deciding to keep the children off school.

Today we have our Winter Fair after school. The PA have been working incredibly hard to get everything ready and I am sure it will be a huge success. I hope to see many of you there—it starts straight after school. If any of you are able to help out for a short stint on any of the stalls I know it will be greatly appreciated. Here's hoping by the end we are a step closer to raising all we need for the junior playground. Have a great weekend and hope those watching the England game this evening get the result they are hoping for!

#### Attendance Award

Attendance this week was very low at 88.6%. This is mainly due to a number of children who have been missing multiple days, all across the school but especially in Reception and KS1, with various illnesses. No class was above 96% this week with Year 4 the highest at 94.1%. While we know that from time to time children will be too unwell to be here we would ask you to support their learning by not keeping off for too long when coming back from illness. Being in school, with many children, often takes their minds off not feeling 100% as they are kept so busy. It is best to send them in if you are in doubt and we would send them home if over the day they don't improve. Missing days has such a big impact on their learning and we want them to learn to be resilient. Overall attendance for the year is currently 94.4%.

Entries should be handed in to the school office and should have the child's name and class on the back (in pencil) along with an indication of the person or event that inspired it.



# Creative Writing—Character Descriptions in Year 4 from work looking at Charles Dickens' Oliver Twist:


