Message from the head:

This week I had to make the difficult decision to close the school next Wednesday due to the industrial action by the NEU. I know the members of that union don't take decisions like striking lightly and I think the fact this is the first teachers strike in many years highlights this. What is often lost in media coverage about the recent strikes, whether it be the nurses, rail workers, teachers or whoever, is the huge increases in basic running costs we have all seen over the last few years and the impact on service delivery. This means year on year we are stretched to even manage the same level of support with less money. Coming through the pandemic has meant more than ever we need to be able to do more and more and sadly often lack the financial resources to do that. With the extra pressure this brings on staff it is no surprise when you read about the teacher shortages and the number of people leaving the profession over the last few years. The staff at Fleet are incredibly dedicated to doing the best for your children and delivering for them the best educational experience they can. While I recognise my decision to close the school next week will be inconvenient for parents, at the same time as leading to your children missing a days education, I hope there is some level of understanding as to why teachers are doing what they are doing. You will also know there are further days of strike action planned for March. As soon as I know more as to how many, if any teachers, will be available on those days, I will be able to make a decision as to whether school will need to close. Thanks for your patience and understanding throughout this period. Next week (see below for details of days) we are holding maths open mornings in KS1 and KS2. I hope many of you will be able to come along and get some ideas for fun maths activities you can do at home to support your children. Also below are details of an opportunity to take part in the London Mini Marathon. It requires parental support on the day (a Saturday in April). P

London Mini Marathon

On Saturday April the 22nd, the London Marathon is being run (the day before the real event). This is open to school children from all over London. There are two possible distances (1 mile for Reception to Year 7; 2.6km for Year 5 to Year 12). It is free to enter and there is a medal for any child taking place. £10 per finisher is also donated to the school. To take part entry must be done through school. As this is an event taking place on a weekend we want to know if there is enough interest for us to request places. If you would be interested in obtaining a place for your child, and are available to accompany them on the day, please let us know by contacting the school office by end of the school day on Monday next week to we have time to request places if there is enough interest. Thank you.

Punctuality Award

This week, as usual, the majority of children managed to get to school on time. Overall lates were up this week by 7 compared to last week with 47! More than half of these were from two classes—year 2 (17) and year 6 (10). A massive thank you to Year 5 who had just 1 late and also special mention to year 3 and 4 with 3 lates each. Please ensure that children are arriving at school in plenty time. We will have some exciting news about breakfast club to share with you soon and we hope this will encourage more of the children to come in to school earlier. Being in and settled at 9am ready to start makes such a difference to the children and their learning and ultimately their educational outcomes. Please, if your child was late this week, do all you can to avoid this being repeated.

Attendance Award

Our attendance continues to move in the right direction. All classes were above 90% this week and 3 classes beat the target of 96% (Year 2, 3 and 5) with the best being year 2 with 97.4%. Year 1 continued their recent improvements coming very close to the target with 95.6%. For the week we were also up on last week with 94.9% - we're getting closer and closer to our goal of 96%. For the academic year we are still way down on that target but week on week now for the last 3 weeks we continue to creep up as the class attendances improve. We are now at 92.3%, up 0.2% from last week. We hope this continues with children seeming to be recovering from the many bugs that have been around and also hopefully building their immunity moving forward for the rest of Winter and into Spring. A big thank you for your continued support in ensuring the children are in school as much as possible.


Children can use any art medium in their entries as long as it is A4 in size and they can enter as many times


This week at Fleet





































































































This week at Fleet...
