

#### Message from the head:

What a fabulous way to end a week-the infant Christmas performance. In preparing for a governors meeting this week, I was reflecting on the term we have had so far and looking back at the various topics, events, trips and learning the children have had and the impact these have on their development as learners. The impact of the rich curriculum the children experience here at Fleet cannot be underestimated and was something the OF-STED inspector commented so positively on during his inspection of the school earlier this term. On Thursday I was showing some prospective parents round the school and one asked a question about trips and did we do any—when I told the group how many trips, visits and workshops children do on average a parent who was looking round of an older child was amazed we did so many—his experience of other schools was far fewer. This is no accident. We value the city we live in and all the opportunities it offers us. We want all the children to feel their learning has context and purpose and so take it out of the classroom and out of pure book learning as much as we can. As we approach the end of the term I want to thank you, our amazing community, for helping us to do that. For volunteering to come on all the trips, for helping put on class teas, discos and fairs, for coming back late to pick up from a sports competition or a theatre trip, for helping your children remember to bring in their instruments (even when they don't need them like this week—sorry the message never made it to you year 4 and 5 parents!), for making time to celebrate your children's learning be that by popping in to the home learning exhibition or coming to class assemblies. All these act help to make our school a better place and help our children to want to learn and do well.

Next up for the shows we have our junior performance next week. Please remember the daytime performance is open to all parents, while the evening performance (which all junior children are expected to attend (6pm for year 6; 6.30pm for Y3-5) is ticketed. Please apply for tickets via the office. I've seen and heard some of their rehearsals and I think it's going to be amazing—after the infants there's a lot to live up to but the juniors haven't let us down yet!
