For your hard work and positivity! You have been putting in your best effort in every lesson and have been kind and helpful to all those around you. Well done!

















Entries should be handed in to the school office and should have the child's name and class on the back (in pencil) along with an indication of the person or event that inspired it.
































Dates for your dary this term...
