#### Message from the head:

Here we are somehow at the end of the Spring Term. This term is always the shortest in the year, however, with the same amount of things to fit in as the Autumn and Summer it always ends up being a very, very busy one. This is the time of the year when I am working through the school budget and setting the budget for the coming year. In a governor meeting this week we looked at the draft budget for next year and we had a discussion about what the increasingly difficult financial landscape means for the school this coming year and beyond. The simple answer is that our single biggest cost is from staffing costs. We are a small school, that is very inclusive. This means we welcome children from the most able to those with complex special educational needs and do everything we can to ensure that all children can access our curriculum and achieve to the best of their ability. This requires staff to be dedicated and rigorous in their approach and I am very thankful my staff are second to none in this respect. Over the last few years we have seen the available staff reduce and when we have needed extra staff, finding them in the current job, market has been exceptionally challenging. Over the next year and beyond, we may face even more difficult decisions than we have up to now and this could lead to us having to manage with less and less—including staffing. If this happens, we will need to rethink many of our current approaches to our curriculum and to the opportunities we have currently managed to deliver for all of your children. I want to thank all of you in the Fleet community for your unwavering support over the last few years, be that through supporting your child with their learning at home, coming on trips and to events here in school, and offering payments and donations to us when you have been able to so we have been able to keep the school going. We have so much we want to continue to do and many ideas for new things we want to do too—as always, funding will be a priority in achieving those goals moving forward. Have a great break and I look forward to seeing you all back on the 18th April.
























## Some fantastic Diary Writing from Year 5...
