Well done to these children who have been chosen by their class teachers to be the 'Star of the Week' - Well done to all these children, and to all the rest who might not have been picked this week but could have been.

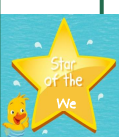
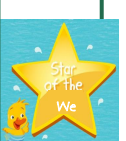
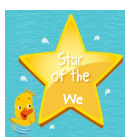
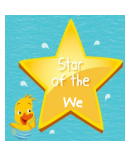


Reception

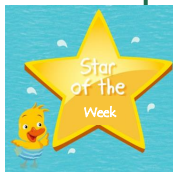
for not only your great efforts in class this week but also your kindness toward others. You are so considerate and thoughtful - we are so lucky to have you as a member of the year 2 team!

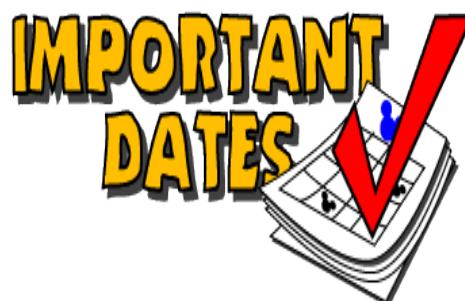

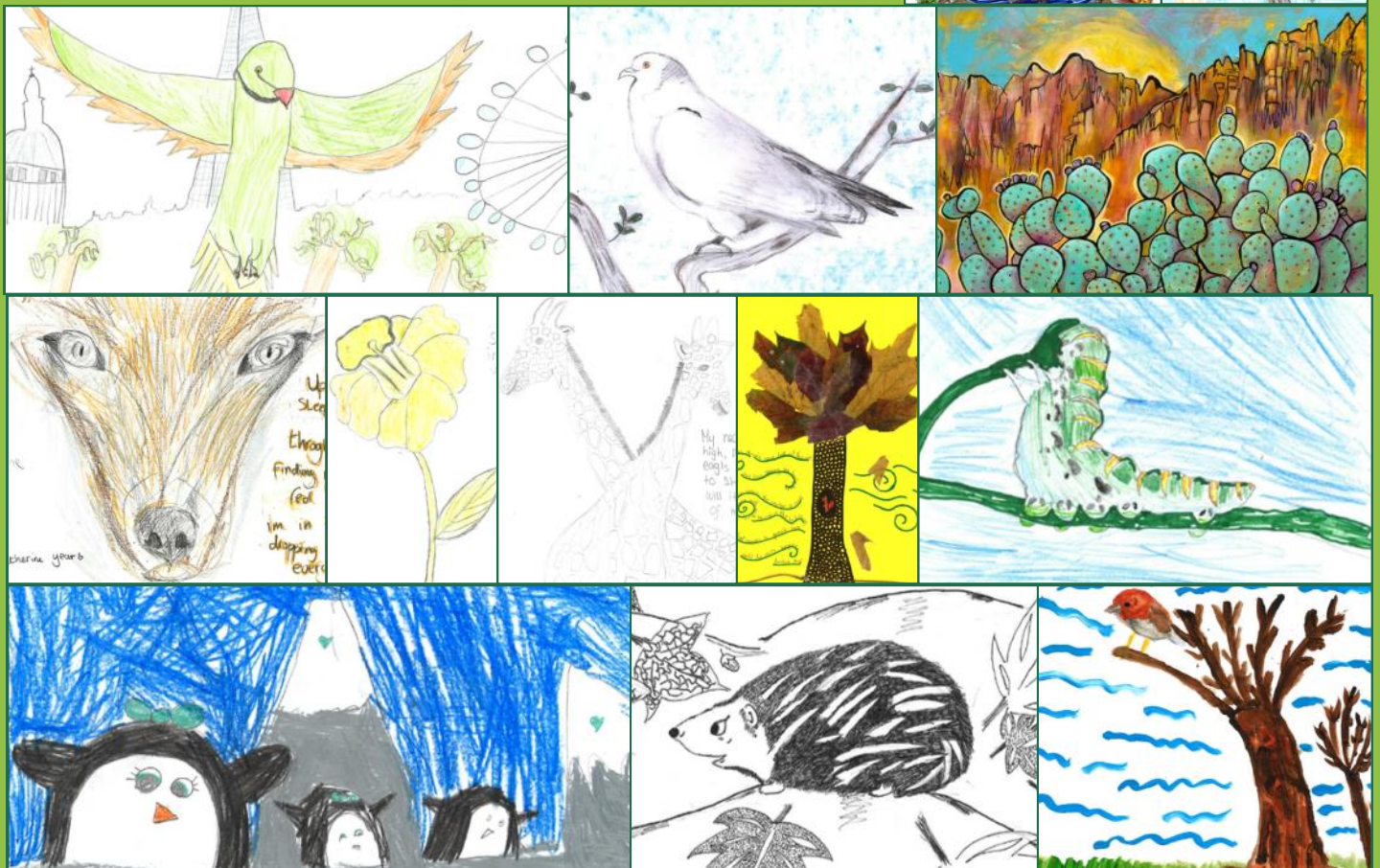
Fleet Primary School Calendar Competition 2024

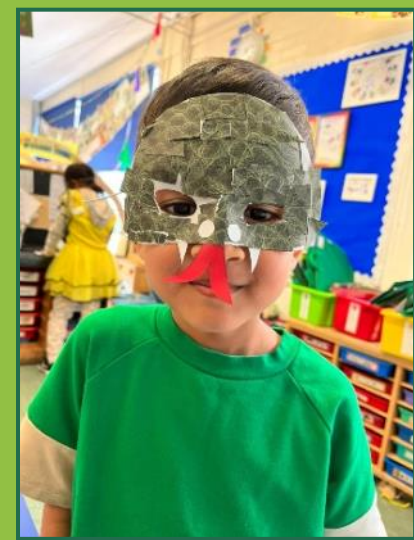
Welcome to our garden update...
