Message from the head: Happy New Year to you all! Its has been lovely to see you all coming back after the winter break. The staff have been hard at work making sure the children have been able to hit the ground running and new topics are already well underway. Next week you will be receiving the topic letter and snapshot from your child's class with all the important information you will need for this term in respect to the learning and trips/events taking place. This term is a relatively short one in comparison to the Autumn term but that means there is a lot to pack into a short space of time! I would ask for your continued support to ensure your children are in school on time and as regularly as possible so they maximise the learning opportunities we provide for them. This also extends to supporting and encouraging them to engage with any home learning they are set including practicing their number facts and times tables for their 'Fleet Facts' and 'Times Table Rockstars' as well as daily reading practice. Language and reading is so important to the educational outcomes of children and regular daily practice is key. During our INSET day this week Ruth, our English lead, led a session on inference and fluency. I wanted to share with you something mentioned in the session from a piece of educational research as evidence of the importance of children reading outside of school:

- A student who reads 21 minutes per day outside of school reads almost 2 million words per year.
- A student who reads for less than a minute per day outside of school reads only 8,000 to 21,000 words per year.

From that evidence it is clear the advantage to vocabulary and comprehension by reading regularly at home. I would encourage you to ensure your child is not held back in their progress by not maximising the reading and exposure to new vocabulary that is so important to their successful cognitive development.

On this theme, Nursery have been working on a project this year called 'Camden Kids Talk'. The aim of the project is to boost communication and language skills in Nursery aged children across Camden. Key to this is building vocabulary through talk and questioning. Look out on Monday for a letter about this coming home. While the project is running in

Nursery we will be sharing a 'top tip' each week with you as it is relevant to all children. Have a great weekend and see you all back on Monday.

Thanks to the majority who get here everyday on time ensuring they don't miss any of their learning or disturb others' learning and a special mention for three classes—Year 5 (3 lates); Reception (1 late) and our winners, Year 2 with no lates! If your child has been late this week please try to ensure they are here on time. Your children need your help to get up, get ready and in to school. Being late, even just by a few minutes, gets them off to a disrupted starts and undoubtedly affects their learning. Lets see if we can have better attendance next week?

Attendance Award

A great start to the new term for some of our classes with 4 classes all above 96% - our target level. Well done to them. They are Year 5 (96.2%), Year 1 (96.5%), Year 2 (97%) and this week's attendance prize winners, Year 6 with a fantastic 99.5%!

Illness continues to badly affect the other classes who are all either at or just below 90% which means the overall attendance for the week is pulled down to 93.9% which is very low (although slightly higher than the Autumn average of 93.6% so moving in the right direction. With the current cold snap please ensure that children are well dressed and able to stay warm when they are out to play. Remember, that sniffles, minor colds, coughs or sore throats should not prevent a child being in school if they are fever free and otherwise well. This is traditionally the time of year when there is lots of this going around and we want to support the children to be resilient.


