Message from the head: Firstly, I'd like to thank you all for your fantastic response this year to our requests to ensure children are in school as much as possible. As you will see from bottom of the page, attendance and punctuality has improved dramatically this year from last years levels and we can really see the effect in the children's learning by them missing as little school as possible. As we head into the colder and wetter weather, I hope it continues.

I was very impressed this week when I was able to sneak in and watch the final rehearsal ahead of today's Class Assembly of Macbeth from Year 5—due to a meeting this morning I wasn't able to see the final version. I've been at Fleet long enough that I shouldn't be surprised by the level of the performances on display through these but every time I am! For parents who have known no other school than Fleet these termly events for each class from Year 1-6 must seem normal, but I know from my experience in other schools as a teacher, leader and also a parent that they are not! Our topic based curriculum lends itself well to this approach but the time and effort given to the creative subjects and not allowing our curriculum to be narrowed to just the subjects that are assessed externally is really what allows for these fantastic showcases of



the children's learning. When they come to the end of their life at Fleet—if they have been with us throughout—they will have had the chance to take part in at least 18 class performances! This supports their confidence and clarity in being able to perform and present in front of an audience—an excellent skill for secondary school and life in general. Not to mention providing memories for them and their families that stay with them for a long time. Next week is another of those life memory moments for our Year 5 children as they depart on Monday for their Residential Week at Sayer's Croft. I still remember my own Primary School Residential and I looking forward to spending the end of next week with them. To them (and to you all!) see you all on Monday for the last week before the half term break.

Punctuality Award Another good week third week in a row we have reduced the number of lates only 22 compared to 24 last week, 26 the week before and 38 the one before that. Thanks to the vast majority of you who arrive everyday on time—we have been really impressed by the positive start to this year. Well done to Reception—our winners with just 2 lates. Brilliant effort. Years 1, 2, 3 and 6 tied for second with 3 each leaving. Can we keep improving and bring it down even further next week with any classes having none?

Attendance Award Another brilliant week continuing our current run. Our overall attendance up again and we have hit our target of 96% bang on that for the first time this year so far. For this week we again broke the 96% and up on last week's with 96.7% overall. All year groups were above 96% (with the exception of Reception) which is fantastic. Winners this week were Year 6 with 100% (2nd time this term—amazing!), followed by Year 2 (98.5%), Year 1 (98.4%), Year 3 and Year 4 (both 97.6%) and Year 5 (96.3%). This is brilliant and a huge thank you to you all for your hard work and effort getting your child into school. Maintaining this level of attendance will ensure children maximise their learning potential

Well done to these children who have been chosen by their class teachers to be the 'Star of the Week' - Well done to all these children, and to all the rest who might not have been picked this week but could have been.








Year 5

Deadline for this term is December 1st Good luck!








