Message from the head:

This week I welcomed Andy George, director of learning at Camden Learning to Fleet. On his visit we were looking at Key Stage 1—we spent time watching lessons and chatting to the children before looking through their books and discussing their learning journey and how we assess and support them. I always enjoy showing people the amazing children we have at Fleet and letting the skill of our staff be shared. Andy was very impressed with what he saw—the standard of the teaching and support, the enthusiasm and attitude of the children, the work they were doing. Andy commented very positively about the learning journey evident in the children's books—how you could clearly see the improvement as they move through the year and that the targets being set and the instructions being given in marking are being acted on and improved by the children. I know what a great job the staff do and it's great when others come in and can see it too!

I'd like to say a huge well done to the children who took time over the winter break to do some writing and enter the winter writing competition. It was great to see the number of entries and also the quality of what the children did. The winners (and an extract from their piece) can be seen on page 9—I am quite jealous of their prize—I must get along to the British Library myself to see the exhibition they are going to—it looks great.

We launched out 'Top Tips' from the Camden Kids Talk project this week—you should have received a letter about this and may have seen some posters up around the school. Each week we'll be adding another. Please do take a moment to look at them, read them and try them. They will make a difference to children's language and communication development.

It has been bitterly cold this week. While temperatures look set to rise a little over the weekend please do keep ensuring your children are well wrapped up with a warm coat, hat and gloves. Labelling clothing with their name and class is really helpful when items are left in play-

grounds so we can get them back to the owner as quickly as possible. I hope you all enjoy your weekend and look forward to seeing you all back on Monday.

Suddenly, screams came from every direction in the room and he went cold as ice.




The other man was sniggering silently.
