Attendance Award

It's been another poor week for attendance with many children unfortunately succumbing to illness. Thank you to those of you ensuring your children return to school as soon as they are able following illness to minimise the learning they miss. We dropped another couple of tenths for overall attendance this year to 94.4% a little further below that 95% mark considered 'good attendance'. For the week, we are very low (although slightly higher than last week) at 91.6%. Year 2, Year 3 and Year 5 were all above 95% which is great. Well done to the winners who were Year 5 this week with a brilliant 98.5%. We know the majority of you ensure that your children come in as often as possible and we ask for your continued support. For those who have been ill we wish you a speedy recovery. Hopefully as we move forward we can get back up to the high levels seen earlier this term and get all classes above 95%.
