As we say regularly, attendance makes such a difference to school success and getting off to a good start to the year and forming those habits early is really important. Please support your children to be resilient and come to school everyday. Thanks to the many children this week with 100% attendance there is 164 out of 226 of you so with 100% for the year! Lets try to be above 96% for the whole school next week.


