Paying Online—Bookbags and Trips

Some of you may have noticed on Scopay there is the option to pay for book bags online now (£3.50). Please note, this is not a debt you owe or charge that has to be paid. It is if you want to buy one you can now pay online and collect in the office. Some parents have been confused thinking it is a debt—it isn't. the option is simply added should you wish to buy one this way rather than having to bring cash into the office. Sorry for any confusion.

You can also now pay the voluntary contribution of £2 for trips on here rather than send cash in with your child. You can do this by paying per trip, or for the term. We recommend £10 per term to cover all trips in a term. We are also still accepting cash is you prefer.
