Punctuality Award We have been doing brilliantly with punctuality this

term but after last week's low of 10 we have gone up

to 31 this week. Thanks to the majority who get here everyday on time ensuring they don't miss any of their learning or disturb others' learning. The most punctual classes this week was Year 4 with just 2 lates with reception just behind with 3. Year 1 and Year 4 came next with 4. Year 2, Year 5 and Year 6 had 5, 7 and 6 lates respectively. We know from previous weeks you can do better! If your child has been late this week please try to ensure they are here on time. Your children need your help to get up, get ready and in to school so please do all you can to support them.

Attendance Award

Year 2 continue their recent good run with another win this week-98.5%, just pipping Year 4 who had 98.4%! Year 5 not far behind, and above the target with 96.7%. Year 6 and year 3 didn't quite make the target level of 96% with 94.9% and 93.3% respectively. Reception and Year 1 were very low this week with a number of illnesses still lingering around which brings us down to 92.5% for the week. Up on last week but still a way to go to reach where we want to be and the levels required for the children to make the most of their learning opportunities. Overall for the year we remain at 93.7%. We know at this time of year there are some coughs and colds around but we urge you to consider carefully if a child needs to be missing school and to ensure they come back as soon as able. We all need to be able to develop our resilience. Thank you for your support in this.

For always trying so hard in lessons! You are determined to improve and you are making such fantastic progress! Keep up the superb attitude to work! Well done superstar!






Year 4

Talking in two or more languages helps my brain develop. This makes it easier for me to learn English and other languages.








The theme this year is **'Famous buildings and landmarks around the world'.** Big thankyou to school council for coming up with this year's theme.
