# General Health & Safety Reminders...

- Don't send in any snacks or food containing nuts - we are a nut free school.
- If your child is going on a playdate with another parent after school please make sure to let the teacher know directly. Do not rely on the other parent to tell us.
- If you change phone numbers or addresses please let us know immediately. We need your current contact details.

# Weekly Punctuality Award

**Punctuality Update:** This week, our total number of lates was **22**, up slightly from **19** last week. While we've seen improvements in some classes, we know we can do even better. A big thank you to all families who are making punctuality a priority – arriving on time helps children start their day feeling calm, focused, and ready to learn.

## How Did Each Year Group Do?

- **Year 6 – 0 lates** (no change): Excellent consistency – well done!
- **Year 3 – 2 lates** (down from 4): A strong improvement – great job!
- **Reception – 3 lates** (down from 5): Much better this week – keep going!
- **Year 1 – 3 lates** (up from 0): A small slip – let's aim for zero again next week
- **Year 4 – 3 lates** (down from 4): A positive step in the right direction
- **Year 5 – 4 lates** (up from 2): A reminder to allow extra time in the mornings
- **Year 2 – 7 lates** (up from 4): Let's focus on a punctual start next week

**Punctuality Matters:** Even arriving just a few minutes late can mean missing key routines and important instructions. It also disrupts the flow of learning for others. A calm, punctual start sets children up for a more successful and settled day.

## Top Tips for a Calm and Timely Morning

- Get ready the night before: lay out clothes, pack bags, prep lunches
- Aim to leave 10 minutes earlier than usual
- Enjoy a free bagel in the playground from 8:30am – a positive way to begin the day

# Weekly Attendance Award

**Attendance Update:** A huge thank you to all our pupils and families for your continued commitment to excellent attendance. We're so pleased to see a big improvement across the school this week – it's been fantastic to see our classrooms full of enthusiastic learners. **Congratulations to Year 1**, who topped the attendance chart this week with an impressive **98.9%** – an outstanding effort!

## Weekly Attendance Summary

- **Year 2:** 97.3% (up from 83.0%) – Great job!

- **Year 4:** 97.4% (up from 76.7%) – An amazing effort!
- **Year 5:** 98.0% (up from 90.0%) – Almost at the top – very well done!
- **Year 6:** 97.8% (up from 86.1%) – Strong attendance – keep it up!

We're really proud of everyone's efforts. Let's aim to keep this momentum going – every day in try and keep this up until the end of the Summer term.

Please remember that **holidays during term time are not allowed**, except in **exceptional circumstances** approved by the Headteacher. Unauthorised leave significantly disrupts your child's learning. Under the **London Borough of Camden's attendance policy**, taking your child out of school for a holiday may result in a **Fixed Penalty Notice: £80 per parent, per child**, if paid within 21 days—rising to **£160** if not paid within 28 days. Repeated unauthorised absences can also lead to a court prosecution, with fines up to **£1,000**, and may impact your child's school place. 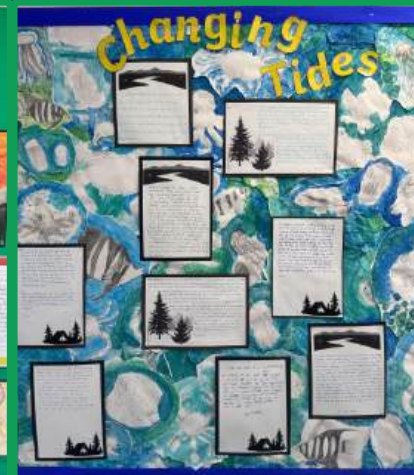

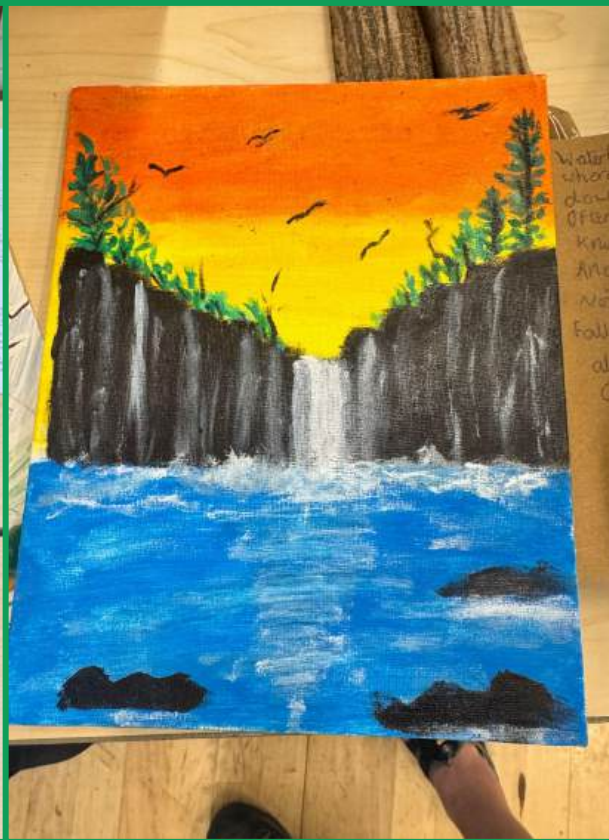


# This week at Fleet...

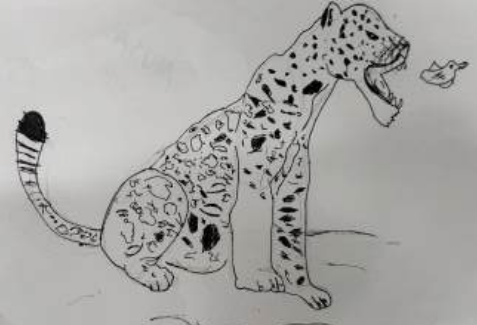
## Facts about squirrel monkeys
