Message from the Head...

This week I've been meeting with teachers as part of their mid-year reviews. It's been great to hear from them how the children are doing and thinking together about the learning journeys still to come before the year ends. I often think time goes very quickly in a school with everything sectioned into daily learning sessions, days, weeks, terms but at the same time the staff manage to fit so much in! Coming up (and already happened this week for Reception) are the Parent-Teacher meetings. At this point in the year it is a great opportunity to meet with your child's class teacher to think together about how they are getting on and what the next steps are for them. It is so important to have that dialogue with home and information sharing goes both ways - not just us telling you about school but listening to you about how they are developing and growing outside of school too. We very much view our relationship as being a team working for a common goal - to give the children the best possible chances in life through developing their academic, social and emotional skills to the fullest. If you have not yet signed up for a meeting slot using the link that was sent home via ParentHub please do so. If you are having any problems with this just phone or message the office and they will be happy to help.

This week attendance has taken a real hit with a couple of nasty bugs going round. See page 4 for more information around what to do if your child is vomiting or has diarrhoea - hopefully we're through the worst of it. Today it looks like the sun has come back after a wet beginning to the week but the temperature has definitely dropped again. Please make sure children are bringing in coats even when its sunny! 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General Health & Safety Reminders...

- Don't send in any snacks or food containing nuts we are a nut free school.
- If your child is going on a playdate with another parent after school please make sure to let the teacher know directly. Do not rely on the other parent to tell us.
- If you change phone numbers or addresses please let us know immediately. We need your current contact details.
- Please do not prop open the main gate to the school site either before or after school. If there is not a member of staff there, the gate should be kept closed.
- If adults need to use the toilet on the school premises, even if accompanying a child, they must use the staff toilets in the corridor.
 - The site is open to parents from 8am for breakfast club, please wait until then, even if a member of staff is buzzed in whilst you're waiting (some parents have been coming in before 8 and leaving their children in the qube unattended)
 - If you are in the junior playground after school, please supervise your children carefully and be mindful that the equipment in the junior playground is designed for older children and is unsafe for little ones. Other playground equipment (balls etc) is not for use after school.
- If you need to walk between the main school and the Nursery please use the path rather than cutting through the hall or corridor.

Weekly Punctuality Award

Punctuality Matters – Let's Keep Up the Great Work! We've made fantastic progress with punctuality this year which is why is was so disappointing to see lates back up above 20 at **26** this week. Overall, lates are still low but this week there was an increase and in many cases the same child being late more than once. If your child was one of those please make sure to try your utmost to get them here on time so they have a calm and settled start to their day.

How Did Each Year Group Do?

Reception – with 2 lates! Same number as last week and this week's most punctual class.

Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 & Year 6 - 3 lates each - still relatively low but we know you can do better and have done repeatedly this year

Year 1 – 3 late - up 1 no last week. We know you can do better!

Year 2 - 8 lates - This is the worst from Year 2 in quite some time. Let's get back to the low numbers we've come to expect from you.

Arriving on time gives everyone the best start to the day. Let's keep working together to make sure every child is in class, ready to learn, right from the start. **Well done, everyone!**

Top Tips for a Smooth Morning

Mornings can be a rush, but small changes can make a big difference! Here are some simple ways to make getting to school on time easier:

Prep the night before - Lay out clothes, pack bags, and fill water bottles in advance.

Set alarms a little earlier – A calm morning sets the tone for the day.

Plan a quick and easy breakfast - Or remember, children can grab their morning bagel at school!

Weekly Attendance Award

Attendance Update – Well Done to Year 6! It's been a challenging week with there being a rather nasty bug going around with a number of children reporting sickness and diarrhoea. Please remember, in an effort to not spread this bug the guidance on vomiting and diarrhoea is that children should not be in school until they have had 24 hours free from these symptoms - call the office if you are unsure. Thank you for your continued support and hopefully as the bug passes we will be back up to the high levels of attendance we have achieved this year moving forward.

Attendance Summary:

- Year 6: 93.9% (down 0.4%) given the current bugs a very respectable showing well done Year 6
- Year 2: 92.4% (down 1.5%) as above, only a slight dip even with the illness circulating well done
- Reception: 91.5% (down 3.5%) undoubtedly affected by the bugs circulating
- Year 5: 90.7% (down 4.6%) as above hope all still out are making a speedy recovery and back soon
- Year 4: 90.3% (down 5.3%) two weeks in a row impacted by illness 99.9% three weeks ago! Hopefully through the worst of it
- Year 3: 88.6% (down 2.3%) second week in a row with amongst the highest levels of illness
- Year 1: 86.4% (down 9.9%) from top to bottom in a week get well soon year 1 children who have been ill.

Overall School Attendance:

Our whole school attendance this week was **90.5%** down 3.9% from last week mainly for the reason given at the top. This has meant overall for the school year has dipped slightly to **94.6%**. We're still close to our goal – let's keep going and work together to reach that **96%** each week and bring up the overall for the year.

Attendance Spotlight:

We held another set of attendance meetings recently. Alison, our School Inclusion Officer from Camden, came in to review attendance and met with parents. She will be visiting again in April.














This week at Fleet...







The children were enthusiastic and resilient throughout and made us very proud - check out the trophy they won in the cabinet!











































