Weekly Attendance Award

This week, Year 5 are top with 98% attendance, well done Year 5. Year 4 are in second place with 95.3%, followed by Year 2 at 94.3% and Year 6 at 94.1%. Year 3, Year 1 and Reception came in slightly lower—all at 92% or below. Our overall attendance for the week is 95.6% which is just below our target of 96%. Whilst we understand that it is the season for coughs and colds, we need to encourage resilience and often we find that children are able to manage and get through the day with the distraction of being in school.
