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General Health & Safety Reminders...

- Don't send in any snacks or food containing nuts we are a nut free school.
- If your child is going on a playdate with another parent after school please make sure to let the teacher know directly. Do not rely on the other parent to tell us.
- If you change phone numbers or addresses please let us know immediately. We need your current contact details.
- Please do not prop open the main gate to the school site either before or after school. If there is not a member of staff there, the gate should be kept closed.
- If adults need to use the toilet on the school premises, even if accompanying a child, they must use the staff toilets in the corridor.
 - The site is open to parents from 8am for breakfast club, please wait until then, even if a member of staff is buzzed in whilst you're waiting (some parents have been coming in before 8 and leaving their children in the qube unattended)
 - If you are in the junior playground after school, please supervise your children carefully and be mindful that the equipment in the junior playground is designed for older children and is unsafe for little ones. Other playground equipment (balls etc) is not for use after school.
- If you need to walk between the main school and the Nursery please use the path rather than cutting through the hall or corridor.

Weekly Punctuality Award

Punctuality Update – Let's Keep Striving for Timely Starts: This week, our total number of lates was 28, a decrease from 34 last week – a great step in the right direction! Thank you to all families who made an effort to improve punctuality. Arriving on time helps children start their day feeling calm, focused, and ready to learn.

How Did Each Year Group Do?

- Year 1 1 late (same as last week): Still going strong well done for staying consistent.
- Year 6 2 lates (up from 0): A slight increase, but overall a strong effort let's aim for zero next week.
- Year 5 3 lates (down from 8): Excellent improvement great bounce back!
- Year 4 4 lates (down from 7): Much better this week keep it going.
- Reception 5 lates (same as last week): Holding steady can we bring that number down next week?
- Year 3 6 lates (same as last week): Still room to improve we know you can do it.
- Year 2 7 lates (same as last week): Let's work together for a stronger start next week.

Punctuality Matters

Even arriving just a few minutes late can mean missing the start-of-day routines and important instructions. It also disrupts the class and can leave children feeling unsettled. A smooth start supports a more successful day.

Top Tips for a Calm and Timely Morning:

- Get ready the night before: Lay out clothes, pack bags, and prep lunches
- Aim to leave 10 minutes earlier than usual
- Enjoy a free bagel in the playground from 8:30am a positive start to the day

- Breakfast Club is available from 8:00am in the QUBE
- Free bagels are served daily from 8:30am in the playground
- Children arriving after 9:00am will be marked as late

Weekly Attendance Award

Attendance Update: Thank you to all pupils and families for your ongoing support with attendance. This week, we're pleased to see some fantastic improvements – especially from Year 1, who made a big jump of nearly 7%! And well done to Year 5 for once again topping the chart with an impressive 97.2%.

Let's take a look at how each class performed:

Weekly Attendance Summary

- 1. **Year 5:** 97.2% (down from 98.8%) Still leading the way well done
- 2. Year 6: 95.6% (down from 100%) A slight drop but still strong
- 3. **Year 1:** 95.2% (up from 88.3%) Fantastic improvement great effort
- 4. Year 4: 93.9% (up from 89.9%) A solid bounce back keep it going
- 5. Reception: 92.8% (down from 95.1%) A little lower this week let's aim higher
- 6. Year 3: 89.4% (down from 96.1%) A noticeable dip let's work hard to get back on track after the break
- 7. **Year 2:** 86.0% (down from 89.1%) Let's work together for a stronger week ahead

Whole School Attendance

- This week: 92.8% (down from 93.8%)
- Year to date: 94.5% (slightly down from 94.6%)

Our school target is 96%, and while we're not quite there this week, we've seen some real efforts to improve – especially in Year 1 and Year 4. Let's keep aiming high together.


