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# General Health & Safety Reminders...

- Don't send in any snacks or food containing nuts we are a nut free school.
- If your child is going on a playdate with another parent after school please make sure to let the teacher know directly. Do not rely on the other parent to tell us.
- If you change phone numbers or addresses please let us know immediately. We need your current contact details.
- Please do not prop open the main gate to the school site either before or after school. If there is not a member of staff there, the gate should be kept closed.

**Punctuality Update:** This week, our total number of **lates was 30**, an increase from **18** last week – a reminder of the importance of punctual starts. Thank you to all families who continue to support strong punctuality. Arriving on time helps children settle into their day calmly and ensures they don't miss valuable learning time.

#### **How Did Each Year Group Do?**

- Year 6 0 lates (no change): Excellent consistency fantastic effort!
- Year 3 0 lates (down from 2): A perfect week brilliant improvement!
- Reception 7 lates (up from 1): A big increase let's try to turn this around next week.
- Year 1 7 lates (up from 4): A noticeable rise a good time to revisit morning routines.
- Year 2 7 lates (up from 3): Let's aim to reduce this next week every minute counts!
- Year 4 7 lates (up from 6): A slight increase please try to leave home earlier.
- Year 5 2 lates (no change): Holding steady let's aim for zero!

#### Why Punctuality Matters: Even arriving just a few minutes late can mean missing:

- Key routines
- Morning instructions
- The chance to start the day calmly

A punctual start helps children feel more confident, focused, and ready to learn.

#### Top Tips for a Calm and Timely Morning

- Get ready the night before lay out clothes, pack bags, prep lunches
- Aim to leave 10 minutes earlier than usual
- Enjoy a free bagel in the playground from 8:30am a positive way to begin the day

- Term-Time Holidays Reminder: Please remember that holidays during term time are not permitted unless approved under exceptional circumstances by the Headteacher. Under the London Borough of Camden's attendance policy, unauthorised leave may result in a Fixed Penalty Notice of £80 per parent, per child (if paid within 21 days rising to £160 after 28 days). Repeated unauthorised absences can lead to court prosecution, fines up to £1,000, and may affect your child's school place.



Next week, each class winner will pitch their toy to the whole school, and the School Council will choose a whole school winner!






















