## Message from the head:

What a wet end to the week! I'd like to say a huge well done to all of you who, despite the weather get up early and arrive in school on time. Punctuality is an important skill to learn in life. I was really disappointed to see the sharp rise in the number of children arriving late to school this week. As you can see from the data below—we went from only 17 last week to 61 lates this week! I note with interest that the best class (again!) this week was our Year 6 children, the vast majority who come in to school independently. It is our job as parents to ensure that we set good examples of time keeping and ensure that the whole family wake up in good time, so that children can get ready in a stress free way. We want the children to grow up to be resilient, inquisitive, enthusiastic learners. On top of these qualities, to succeed in life they also need to be reliable—good attendance and punctuality is a demonstration of that. If this is something we as adults struggle with, we need to ensure that we do not pass this on to our children. Please do endeavour to get the children here early (equally please ensure you are able to pick them promptly at the end of the day so they are not left waiting while everyone else has gone). The vast majority of you manage this and we really do appreciate your help with this—moan over! On the theme of the weather, as it is so changeable at the moment, please do ensure

children have coats and suitable footwear on when they come in. We always try to get the children out to play—fresh air and movement is so important. Even on rainy days, when there is a break we will take them out if we can. Have a restful weekend and see you all on Monday.

## Weekly Attendance Award

This week, Year 6 are top with just under 100% attendance, well done! Year 2 are in second place along with last week's winners, Y5—both above 98%. Year 1 are also above the target level of 96% with Year 3 a fraction below. There is room for improvement from Year 4 and Reception. Overall for this week attendance is 96.2% - this would be even higher above the 96% target level but is being pulled down by the low attendance in Year 4 and Reception. Whilst we understand that it is the season for coughs and colds, we need to encourage resilience and often we find that children are able to manage and get through the day with the distraction of being in school. It's particularly important for the youngest children to build good attendance habits right from the start of their school life. We will always call if they are not feeling well enough to stay. If your child has been off sick, it is also important to bring them back to school as soon as they are well again. Thank you for your continued support.
