Attendance Update – Big Shoutout to Year 6! Well done to Year 6, who are topping the attendance chart this week with an amazing 98.5% attendance – what a brilliant achievement! That's a 2.9% boost from last week. Keep it up, superstars!

Attendance Summary:

- Year 6 98.5% (12.9%) In 1st place this week fantastic effort!
- Year 1 98.2% (10 0.8%) A strong 2nd place and still climbing great job Y1!
- Year 5 97.5% (1 8.4%) The biggest rise of the week an incredible comeback for Y5!
- Reception 96.9% (2.4%) Still a solid performance in 4th place!
- Year 3 96.1% (1.18%) A small drop but still above our target keep it up Y3!
- Year 4 95.2% (1.4%) Slightly down this week but still close to our target!
- Year 2 92.8% (U) 3.7%) A drop this week let's see if we can turn that around next week, Y2!

Whole School Attendance: This week, our overall school attendance was 96.5% – that's up 0.3% from last week! Our year-to-date average is 94.6%, a slight improvement of 0.1%. We've hit our target of 96% this week – fantastic work everyone! Let's keep this momentum going!

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
