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# General Health & Safety Reminders...

- Don't send in any snacks or food containing nuts we are a nut free school.
- If your child is going on a playdate with another parent after school please make sure to let the teacher know directly. Do not rely on the other parent to tell us.
- If you change phone numbers or addresses please let us know immediately. We need your current contact details.
- Please do not prop open the main gate to the school site either before or after school. If there is not a member of staff there, the gate should be kept closed.
- If adults need to use the toilet on the school premises, even if accompanying a child, they must use the staff toilets in the corridor.
  - The site is open to parents from 8am for breakfast club, please wait until then, even if a member of staff is buzzed in whilst you're waiting (some parents have been coming in before 8 and leaving their children in the qube unattended)

- Year 4 6 lates (11): A tricky week for Y4 we believe in your bounce back!



#### Top Tips for a Smooth Morning:


- Prep the night before: Clothes ready, bags packed saves time in the morning rush!

## Weekly Attendance Award

\*\*Attendance Update – Well Done Year 3! \*\*A huge congratulations to Year 3, who are topping our attendance chart this week with 96.5% – a steady 0.4% boost from last week. Keep up the brilliant work, Y3!

#### Weekly Attendance Summary:

- 1st Year 3: 96.5% ( 0.4%) Great consistency!
- 2nd Year 2: 96.1% ( 3.3%) Big jump this week well done Y2!
- 3rd Year 6: 95.8% ( 2.7%) Still strong despite a slight drop.
- 4th Year 5: 94.7% ( 2.8%) Let's aim higher next week, Y5!
- 5th Year 4: 94.4% ( 0.8%) Almost there a little push will do it.
- 6th Reception: 94.1% ( 2.8%) A dip, but still a good effort.
- 7th Year 1: 89.2% ( 9.0%) A big drop this week let's turn that around next time, Y1!

#### Whole School Attendance:

This week, our overall attendance stands at **94.4%** – a bit below our target of 96%, but we're still making progress. Every day counts, so let's keep aiming high! Our attendance from September to now stands at a steady 94.6%.

#### **Solution** Why Attendance Matters

Regular attendance is vital for your child's learning and future success. According to the Department for Education, primary school pupils with 95–100% attendance in Year 6 are 30% more likely to meet the expected standard in reading, writing, and maths compared to those attending 90–95% of the time. Every day in school counts towards building knowledge, confidence, and long-term achievement.


